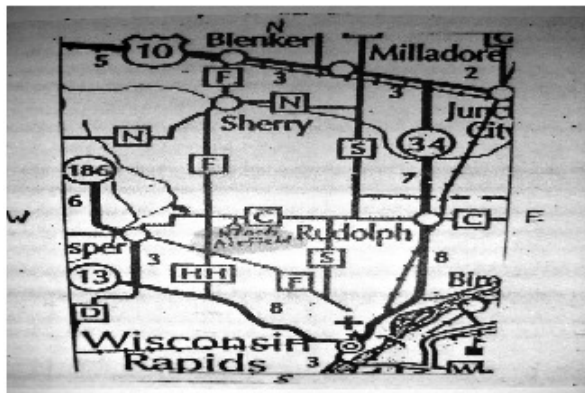

April 6, 2013**

Meeting: President Bob Mohr called the April meeting to order at 10:45 am after we ate breakfast. 33 members were present. Deb Mohr took the minutes. Bob asked for any corrections or additions to the March 2013 minutes as printed in the April Haymeadow Flyer. There being none, he asked for a motion to accept. The names of the motion maker and seconder were not recorded. The motion passed. Bob asked for approval for the March treasurer's report, as printed in the April Haymeadow Flyer. The names of the motion maker and seconder were not recorded. This motion also passed.

The Unertl family made a presentation. The following are the words of Darlene Unertl:

“Dustin and Tyler Unertl, who are members of EAA Chapter 640 are 15 year old twin boys who both began working on the Zenith STOL CH 750 airplane right from the start when the project began at the AirVenture Homebuilders Hangar. Both boys and their family travel to Central County Airport, a 140 mile round trip, most Tuesdays to work with the fine leaders and with a group of kids to build something that they can one day fly. The group has visions of being at AirVenture again with the plane, but at this point, they need to raise funds to complete the construction of the Zenith airplane. If you have any questions, you may call our family at 715-693-4575. You may also log into www.aviatorsbydesign.com to see video of our project.

“This is the same fund raising method that Jessica Cox is using to raise funding for her Right Footed documentary.”

Bob called for discussion so we could vote on Proposal #2 and #3 from the Board of Directors.

Bob Wylie explained the scholarships that are given by the Wisconsin Aviation Hall of Fame and by the Archie Towle Scholarship Fund. He said that the Hall of Fame awards 3 scholarships each year. Most of the recipients are studying aircraft mechanics or flight instruction. He said that the Wisconsin Tech schools are dropping their aviation mechanic programs, and so the Hall of Fame committee is now funding instruction in schools in other states. The applicants must be residents of Wisconsin for at least the past 5 years. Many of the applicants are directly out of high school, but many more are looking for a second career. Some are military veterans.

The Archie Towle Scholarship Fund recipients are drawn from an area within a 50-mile radius of the Wausau airport. They are almost always high school students or just out high school when they apply for the scholarship. About 80% of the past recipients are now in aviation careers. Sixteen scholarships have been awarded so far. Four of the recipients are women.

Voting on the above proposals went as follows:

Proposal #2, to donate \$10,000 of the Bob Payzer Gift to the Archie Towle Aviation Scholarship Fund: 30 members voted in favor of the proposal and 3 voted against. The proposal passed.

Proposal #3, to donate \$10,000 of the Bob Payzer Gift to the Wisconsin Aviation Hall of Fame Scholarship Fund: 27 members voted in favor and 5 members voted against. The proposal passed.

Checks for each of these donations will be given to the scholarship funds in May.

Keith Mathews announced that there will be a “Fly a Vet” day on April 20th, weather permitting at the Stevens Point airport. This can be done as an EAA Eagle Flight Rally, but does not have to be. Keith is looking for more pilots to help.

Motion made by Bob Monk, seconded by Rick Coe to consider a Chapter donation to Aviators by Design. The

motion passed unanimously. We will have to consider a dollar amount to be donated.

An article in the April 2013 Sport Aviation magazine about hangar etiquette by Luran Paine, Jr. was referred to. The Sport Aviation article was on page 46, volume 62, number 4.

Our next Chapter 640 meeting will be Sunday, May 19 at Don & Katy Winch’s airstrip at 11:30 am.

A motion was made to adjourn the chapter meeting by Rick Coe, seconded by Wyatt Chmiel. Motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 am.

MONEY FROM PAYZER GIFT TRANSFERRED

On May 7, Treasurer Syd Cohen transferred \$5,000 from the Payzer Gift Fund to the Chapter General Fund, as specified in Proposal #1, which was passed by the members at the March 2013 meeting. The new total in the Chapter 640 checking account is \$5,246.81 As specified in Proposals #2, a check from the Payzer Gift Fund was made out in the amount of \$10,000 to the Archie Towle Aviation Scholarship Fund. And, as specified in Proposal #3, a check from the Payzer Gift Fund was made out in the amount of \$10,000 was made out to the Wisconsin Aviation Hall of Fame Aviation Scholarship Fund. “Landings For Lunches” 1st Annual Spot Landing Contest For Charity Wausau, Wisconsin

WAUSAU, WIS. – The fixed base operator known for innovation in promoting aviation and flight training, John Chmiel of Wausau Flying Service, Wausau Downtown Airport (KAUW), has created a “spot landing contest” to encourage pilot proficiency, and raise money for a local charity. And unlike most spot landing contests, this contest will be held during the entire month of May 2013 between the hours of 10:30 and 11:30 AM.

Ceilings need to be a minimum of 1500 feet, and visibility 5 statute miles.

All pilots are eligible to participate. In fact, Chmiel would like to see pilots fly in from Milwaukee, Madison, Chicago, Des Moines, the Twin Cities, and all cities in between to participate, then land and borrow his car to go to town for lunch.

Contestants will have to perform a minimum of two landings. The closest to the mark will be used for ranking and the second landing will be used in the case of a tiebreaker. There is a minimum of (2) attempts, but pilots may enter and fly as many landings as they wish.

The \$4.00 entry fee covers two (2) spot landing attempts with \$2.00 going into a pot for the grand prize, and \$2.00 going towards “The Neighbor’s Place” on behalf of Wausau Downtown Airport. The winner will get their name on the trophy and a cash prize! Non-perishable food items are also welcomed!

“We hope to encourage pilots from other airports to make KAUW and ‘Landings For Lunches’ a fun cross-country destination,” said Chmiel. “It’s our way to give pilots a fun excuse to go flying, and to show goodwill between the airport and the community.”

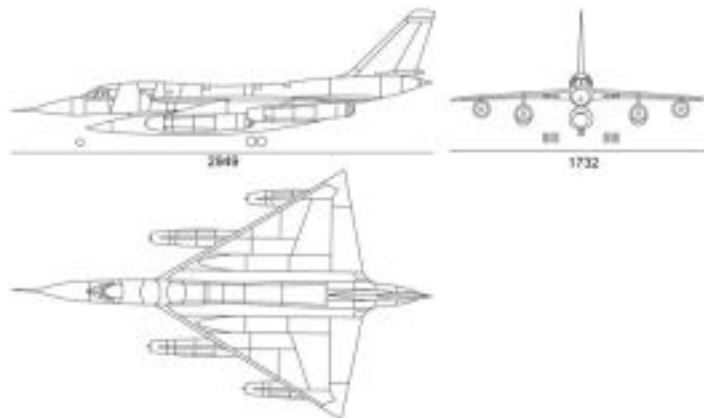
